Who is Eligible?

*Minimum requirements for application for a concealed firearms permit in Utah are:

Applicant must be at least 21 years of age

Proof of good character...whereas the applicant;

has not been convicted of a felony;

has not been convicted of any crime of violence;

has not been convicted of any offense involving the use of alcohol (including DUI);

has not been convicted of any offenses involving the unlawful use of narcotics or other controlled substances;

has not been convicted of any offenses involving moral turpitude;

has not been convicted of any offense involving domestic violence;

has not been adjudicated by a court of a state or of the United States as mentally incompetent, unless the adjudication has been withdrawn or reversed

is qualified to purchase and possess a firearm pursuant to Section 76-10-503 and federal law

*A criminal background check is conducted for all applicants

UTAH CFP*

(*Concealed Firearms Permit)

The State of Utah allows California residents to apply for a Utah Concealed Firearms Permit that is currently accepted in thirty three of the fifty United States.

Weapon Familiarity Certification.

Applicants must complete a firearms familiarity course certified by the Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI). No exceptions. The course must be completed before applying for a permit. A certified BCI Instructor must complete the certification information on the application.

Reciprocity with other states:

Alabama, Alaska, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Pennsylvania, South Dakota, Texas, Virginia, Washington State and West Virginia.

Recognition by other states:

Arizona, Arkansas, Delaware, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Maine, Michigan, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Vermont, Wisconsin and Wyoming.

NOT RECOGNIZED IN CALIFORNIA!

What Must Accompany the Application?

A Photocopy of your state issued Driver License

Photograph. One recent color photograph of passport quality.

Fingerprint Card. One fingerprint card. Must be filled out completely. Writing and prints must be legible. Fingerprint should be taken by a trained fingerprint technician. Fingerprint cards that are not legible will be returned to the applicant and will cause a delay in processing the application.

A non-refundable fee of \$47.00 for non-residents must be included with your application. This fee consists of \$35.00 for non-residents for application and permit processing and \$12.00 charged by the FBI to process your fingerprint cards. Please make checks and money orders payable to the "Utah Bureau of Criminal Identification." Any U.S. citizen or legal resident may obtain a Utah concealed firearm permit, providing they meet the minimum qualifications.

After completion of the course, students must supply a legible fingerprint card, passport style photograph and submit an application with a \$47.00 fee to the State of Utah.

Fingerprints and passport photos are available at many UPS and FEDEX Stores.
